Andrew Stewart is the John Bray Professor of Law at the University of Adelaide. He is one of Australia's leading experts in employment and workplace relations. He is the President of the Australian Labour Law Association and co-director of the Adelaide Law School's Work and Employment Regulation research group.

Professor Stewart will explain how the treatment of collective action in the nineteenth century gradually moved from repression to reluctant tolerance. The introduction of the conciliation and arbitration systems decisively changed the relationship between trade unions and the state. The Keating government legislated in 1993 to create the first ever right to take industrial action. The question now is whether there is any future for the right to strike!
