


This meeting will be preceded by a short Special Meeting at which there will be a vote regarding the granting of Life Membership of the Society to Greg Stevens.

Cecil and Marie Skitch were political radicals associated with the International Workers of the World in the 1920s and each sought parliamentary seats for the Australian Labor Party in the 1930s. Cecil was also notable for his writings on social and economic reform while Marie held senior offices over 30 years in a powerful political lobby group.

It is often assumed that cricket is an Establishment game. Not necessarily so. Cecil enjoyed lifelong cricket success culminating in his organisation of two remarkable cricket tours of the United Kingdom in 1954 and 1956.
